Spring 1 Rights and Responsibilities	All four chaplaincy teams will work together to decide upon a focus group (e.g. refugees/prisoners/homeless). This will be decided in January. This decision will be made from exploring current affairs/world news and then taking part in a democratic vote through school community. The children will host educational workshops or an assembly about the rights and responsibilities of the chosen focus group. The children will then organise an art gallery based on focus group. Parents/family members/parishioners will be charged an entry fee which will be donated to a charity relating to the chosen focus group (e.g. Stories of Hope and Home).
