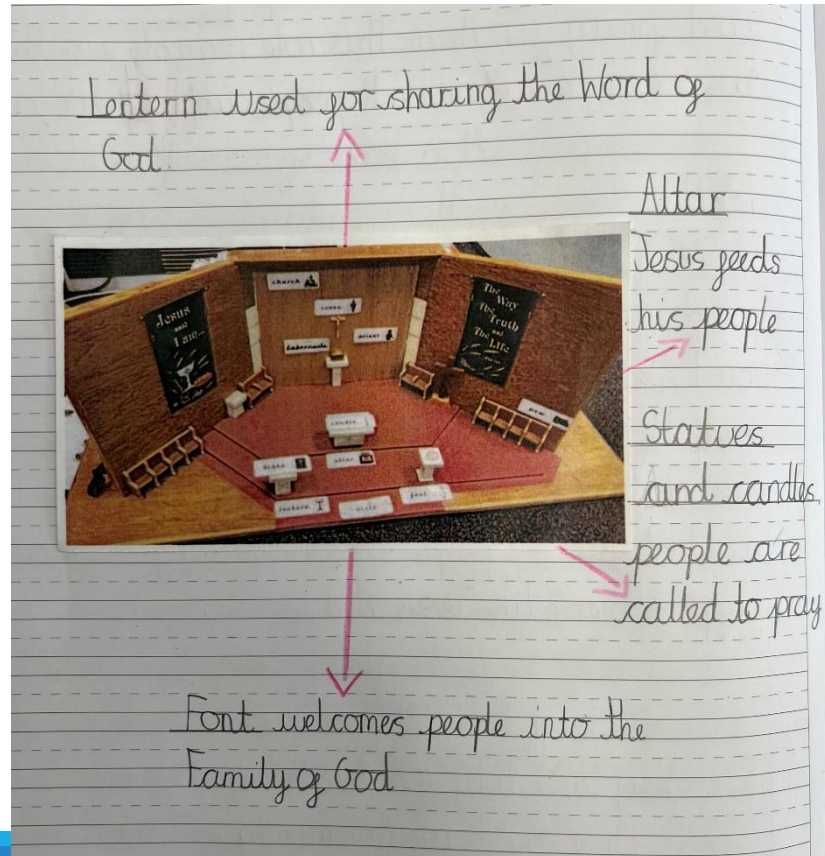

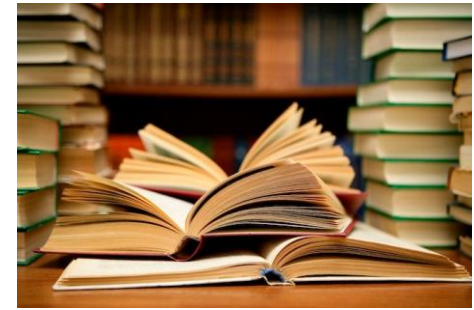

Reading Books

Times Tables & Number Facts

The quick recall of multiplication and division facts (times tables) is **essential** for all children. The ability to recall these facts quickly enables children to answer related questions with ease.

MTC: In June, your children will be tested on their multiplication facts, up to 12×12 . This assessment was brought in by the DfE. It is vital that the children know their times tables and can answer them in less than 6 seconds. Please start practising now as their pace is as important as their knowledge.

Times Tables Rock Stars

Times Tables Rock Stars is a fun and challenging programme designed to help children master their times tables! To be a Times Table Rock Star you need to answer any multiplication fact up to 12×12 in less than 3 seconds! Please help your child learn their times tables by playing on Times Tables Rock Stars in the evenings.
