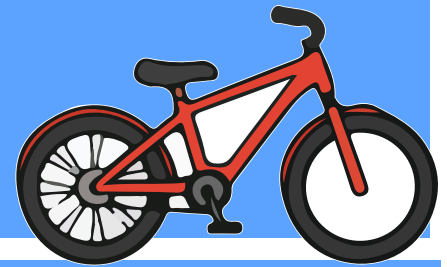
Life at St Peter's ...
